

Examples



Develop emergency transportation and traffic plans.

Document and define emergency transportation and traffic plans to account for ingress / egress lanes for emergency vehicles; allow and account for access for key personnel during an emergency; establish process for tracking (GPS) shuttle bus and other ground transportation operations; and, train / exercise personnel on plan / procedures / process to transport people off of incident site.

Examples



Put a plan in place to manage personal effects during an emergency.

Analyze and activate a 3rd party on-call contract to manage personal effects during emergencies, including: identifying, documenting, tagging, bagging, movement, cataloging, and returning to owners.

Assign a Champion for corrective action planning


- Shepherds the process

- Prioritize tasks


Establish an executive briefing schedule


